Electromagnetic fields and public health: Barack Obama opens consultations

The decision of Barack Obama, the new President of the United States, to set up an independent working group to study the possible links between cancer and radiation from nuclear sources and from the electromagnetic fields created by wireless telecommunications is a great step forward. This question was seen in a different light when it was revealed during the election campaign that Senator McCain and his wife had chosen to live in a White Zone free from mobile phone radiation!



"It's about listening to what our scientists have to say, even when it's inconvenient' and I welcome this approach."

The evidence collected by the working group will be evaluated by the commission appointed by the President to draw up new measures to be taken in order to improve the health of Americans.

This new move will no doubt attract plenty of attention and will certainly influence the whole world.
