Based on my review of this file, I am writing to advise that this matter is now being referred to the Discipline Committee of the Benchers for review at the Committee's upcoming meeting on May 7, 2009. A review by the Discipline Committee does not constitute a Hearing. The Committee meets monthly to review a number of complaints to determine what further action, if any, should be taken. The Committee itself does not take the action, but merely determines whether a complaint should go further to a more serious level or be resolved by the Committee without further action.

The procedure is more fully set out in Rules 4-3 to 4-6 of the *Law Society Rules*.

We will advise you of the Discipline Committee's decision in due course.
